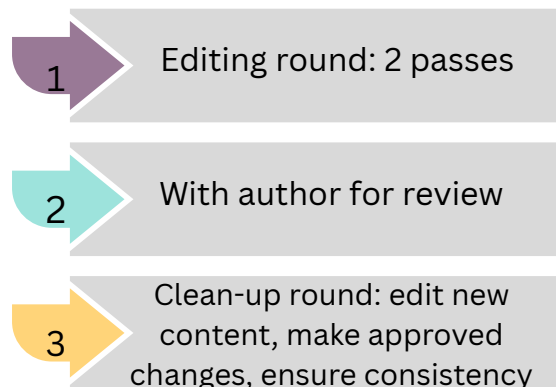

- **Perfect the result:** Every suggested edit is designed to support your goals and improve your skill
